Submission Guidelines:

Complete paper: up to 5-10 pages (including figures, tables, and bibliographic references). Body of text: use a normal, plain font (10-point Times Roman) for text, the first-line indent of 0.75 cm. Use margins of at least 2 cm. Spacing - single. <u>A5 format.</u> Tables and figures (Times New Roman, 8-point size, 1 line spacing). A standard structure of a paper: abstract (150-200 words), keywords (5-8 words), introduction, methods, results, discussion, conclusion, acknowledgments, references.

Abstract of the report: up to 2-4 pages (including figures, tables, and bibliographic references). Body of text: use a normal, plain font (10-point Times Roman) for text, the first-line indent of 0.75 cm. Use margins of at least 2 cm. Spacing - single. <u>A5 format.</u> Tables and figures (Times New Roman, 8-point size, 1 line spacing).

Surname and initials of the author, name of institution is placed in the upper right corner; the paper/abstract title is placed below in capital letters (the example included).

Full name, degree and position of the scientific supervisor are placed at the end of the paper/abstract.

The Committee reserves the right to edit or reject papers/abstracts which do not comply with the above.
